DRAFT CHARTER

Forest and Wood Products RD&E Forum

STRUCTURE AND GOVERNANCE

- 1. The national Forest and Wood Products RD&E Forum ("Forum") will comprise of 12 individuals drawn from three categories: research providers (four people); government as represented by the Forest and Wood Products Council (four people); and industry (four people).
- 2. Participation in the Forum is based upon skills and level of interest it is not intended to be a representative based organisation.
- 3. Participants are allowed to nominate a proxy in their absence.
- 4. The process for identifying the initial participants was coordinated by a small steering committee consisting of Dr Gordon Duff (CRC for Forestry), Lee Miezis (DSE Vic) and Ric Sinclair (FWPA).
- 5. The term for participants is three years with no limit on additional terms.
- 6. Vacancies in the Forum will be filled by candidates from the same category.
- 7. Candidates to fill a vacancy in the Forum will be agreed by all Forum participants.
- 8. A chair of the Forum will elected by Forum participants on an annual basis.
- 9. Ideally, the chairmanship of the Forum will rotate between the three main groupings (i.e. government, research providers and industry).
- 10. Decisions by the Forum will be on a consensus basis.
- 11. Minutes of Forum meetings will be circulated and approved at subsequent meetings.
- 12. The Forum will meet at least twice per annum.

PURPOSE

- 1. Be responsible for the continued development and implementation of the forest and wood products sector national RD&E strategy.
- 2. Provide a national forum for consultation, communication and coordination between the forest and wood products industry and RD&E funders and providers.
- 3. Provide input to Forest and Forest Products Committee, Forest and Wood Products Council, PISC R&D Committee, and other forums of relevance to RD&E.

- 4. Identify initiatives to enhance the forest and wood products sector RD&E capability, investment and cost-effectiveness, including by defining the research capability needed in the sector and developing mechanisms to deliver this.
- 5. Review, on an ongoing basis, common priorities for RD&E in the sector.
- 6. Communicate RD&E outcomes to policymakers and the general public.
- 7. Ensure communication between other primary industry sectors on RD&E priorities, particularly with respect to farm forestry.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- 1. Improvement in national, state and regional collaboration in existing and emerging areas.
- 2. Development of new initiatives to address capability gaps.
- 3. More coordinated capacity in the sector to respond to new directions in knowledge need and to derive benefit from new funding initiatives.
- 4. Publication of a new, sector-wide research priorities analysis.
- 5. Publication of a full analysis of national research capability, and regional development and extension capabilities, including gap analyses.
- 6. Adoption or refinement of within-sector performance measures for RD&E.
